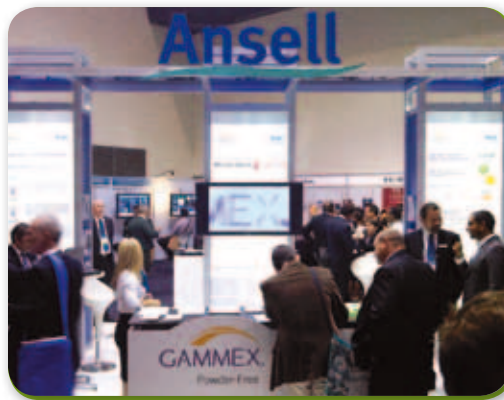

Aseptic Surgery Forum zooms in on **surgical infections**



On the 26th and 27th March 2010, over 1,000 healthcare workers from around 20 countries came together in Paris for the first edition of the Aseptic Surgery Forum: a unique, multi-disciplinary congress on the prevention, diagnosis and treatment of surgical

infections. In the exhibition area, they discovered how Ansell gloves provide exceptional protective characteristics, while ensuring great comfort.

The two-day forum, an initiative of the Paris doctor Patrick Mamoudy, is an innovative concept for practitioners and experts who assist daily in the fight against infections. The attending surgeons, OR nurses, physicians, pharmacists and hospital managers were treated to two days of informative presentations, which provided theoretical, practical and legislative insights into the topic. The exhibition that ran in parallel with the conference was an opportunity to exchange information

with suppliers of innovative equipment, technology and services that help prevent and treat infections.



With hand hygiene and protection playing a crucial role in infection prevention, the conference program included a session on the topic by Olivia Keita-Perse, Chief of the Hygiene and Epidemiology division at Monaco's Princess Grace Hospital. At the Ansell booth, participants learned how Ansell gloves help reduce the infection risk.

Medical Device and Personal Protective Equipment combined

Ansell's surgical and examination gloves are categorized as 'medical devices'. Still, the same glove can be used by a nurse as well as by a lab worker. In the first case, it is classified as a medical device, while when worn in the lab it would be considered as Personal Protective Equipment (PPE). The result: one glove could be subject to different requirements. Since 21st March 2010, unambiguous rules are effective for these 'dual-use products'.



In the example above, both the glove and the reason for using it are the same: to protect the wearer from micro-organisms. However, the glove in the hospital has to fulfil the requirements of the Medical Device Directive (MDD), which states, amongst other specifications, that the producer/importer can certify the glove in its own lab. The safety of PPE products, on the other hand, has to be assessed and certificated by notified bodies. This led to situations where

manufacturers could choose to comply with either the basic health and safety requirements of the PPE Directive (89/686/EEC) or those of the MDD (93/42/EEC).

In line with both MDD and PPE

When the European Commission decided to revise the MDD, many organizations and federations insisted on clearer rules for dual-use products. Their request was heard: in 2007, the Commission approved an amendment that included clear definitions on what procedures to follow for MDD products that can be used as PPE. The new rules became effective on 21st March last. The key message:

if a manufacturer wants to market a product as a MD as well as PPE, the essential requirements of both directives have to be met.

Ansell gloves

Manufacturers who sell 'dual use' products must therefore update their instructions for use and labelling to include PPE instructions and markings, make sure these products are tested for chemical permeation and establish yearly recurring test programs or an annual systems audit. Each glove needs certification by a notified body. Ansell welcomes these new stipulations and trusts all its dual-use gloves will pass the new criteria.



MD, PPE or both?



Whether a glove is categorized as a medical device or as an item of PPE is decided by the nature of the risks involved when used for its intended purpose(s): when risks are present in the interaction between the user

and patient, the glove is covered under the Medical Device Directive; external risks would be covered by the PPE Directive. Dual-use gloves are intended for use both as MD and PPE.



Ansell launches **two more AnsellCares®** online resources

Did you know that 15 February is the European Perioperative Nurses Day? An initiative of the European Operating Room Nurses Association (EORNA), the purpose of this Day is to laud operating room nurses for the great role they play in quality care. This year's theme was 'Patient Safety through Quality Care', thereby drawing attention to the importance of continued professional education. As a close partner of EORNA, Ansell took this opportunity to launch two brand-new online AnsellCares® courses.

In April 2009, AnsellCares® courses on double gloving, glove material, glove powder and electrosurgery received ACE accreditation – an EORNA quality label for



distance learning courses and educational events. Since then, all four courses have been available through the EORNA website, for the nurses to study at their own pace. The tests can be taken online, with final results and accreditation points

available on an EORNA ACE certificate. This February a new course on hand hygiene and one on latex allergies have been added.

European events starring AnsellCares®

Over the past few months, the brand-new AnsellCares® courses got wide coverage at European dedicated congresses, such as the 127th Congress of the German Society for Surgery (with a suitable motto: 'knowing, thinking and acting') and the recent congresses of AFISO and UNAIBODE - the Walloon (Belgium) and French EORNA members respectively.

OR nurse **Frédérique Bienkowski** testifies:

"My work schedule makes it difficult to follow traditional courses. As the AnsellCares® lectures are online, I can chose when to follow the course. Moreover, the system is very easy to work with so the threshold is

very low. I found the hospital hygiene courses particularly interesting. By raising awareness on nosocomial infections and hand hygiene, we can significantly raise the quality and safety of healthcare."

AFISO and UNAIBODE events starring AnsellCares®

AFISO and UNAIBODE - the Walloon (Belgium) and French EORNA members respectively - also have a close partnership with Ansell. The new AnsellCares® courses, and the AnsellCares® concept in general, were therefore highlighted during the recent AFISO and UNAIBODE congresses.

On Friday 23rd April, Ansell experts showcased AnsellCares® to visitors at the AFISO congress. During the closing ceremony, Ansell congratulated Frederique Bienkowski (see box) on her completion of the AnsellCares® courses. At the UNAIBODE meeting (26th – 28th May) in Bordeaux, French operating room nurses learned the ins and outs of AnsellCares® and were invited to an

interactive Ansell workshop on double-gloving. It proved popular: 85 nurses attended the workshop, which was in fact an Eorna Ace accredited training session that entitled them to 1.5 course credits. In the meantime, Ansell has been asked to schedule the same training session at the regional level, so that all France's operating room nurses could learn the importance of double-gloving.



Educational grants for the Royal College of Surgeons of England



In its continuing attempt to share know-how and expertise, Ansell teams up with many specialist associations. Quite recently, a partnership agreement was signed with the

Royal College of Surgeons of England. Ansell's support will help the College develop educational programmes to make sure surgeons stay on top of new technologies and treatments.

An adaptable, well-trained surgical workforce is key to ensure safe patient care and successful outcomes. However, it is difficult for surgeons and their teams to keep pace with rapidly changing technologies and, most importantly, get thorough training. The UK's Royal College of Surgeons therefore constantly develops initiatives to upgrade that education. Ansell's support helps the college finance a couple of recent initiatives like the use of surgical tutors, cadaver dissection courses and bursaries. In return, the partnership brings Ansell closer to one of the world's leading surgical



institutions – which is a great way to gauge the needs and wishes of surgeons and their teams.

Supporting further education by the Royal College of Surgeons of England

On the previous page, we already mentioned how Ansell provided the Royal College of Surgeons of England with some educational grants. Ansell's support will help the College fund initiatives to constantly upgrade surgeons' education. The first initiatives funded by Ansell educational grants took place recently: a series of dedicated, high-level RCS lectures.

In April last, an Ansell representative attended the Tibial Masterclass, a two-day intensive RCS course with workshops to



provide insights into the latest trends in the management of tibial fractures and their consequences. Throughout June,

Ansell participated in seven well-attended one- or two-day courses, three of which were sponsored by Ansell (orthopaedics and vascular).

"Our courses are a must to help surgeons continually sharpen their expertise and skills," says RCS. The large attendance rates confirm that the College is right. For Ansell, the lectures are an ideal opportunity to share knowledge and opinions with the participating surgeons, trainees and consultants, in a relaxed atmosphere, and thereby learn about their needs and wants.

Introducing veterinarians to high-quality hand protection

As announced in the previous edition of InTouch, Ansell UK is making great efforts to demonstrate the added value of Ansell gloves in non-hospital settings. And it's doing well in achieving that aim. The veterinarians, vet assistants, etc. visiting this year's BSAVA (British small animal veterinary association) Congress in Birmingham learned how proper hand protection is a must in their branch too.

Exactly 5,057 people visited BSAVA's 2010 Congress - the world's largest exclusive companion animal event. They were treated to an impressive scientific

programme and an exhibition space where 160 companies showcased their products, from dog food thru' to scanning equipment. More importantly, the Congress offered Ansell a unique platform to make veterinarians, vet assistants and others concerned familiar with the Ansell brand and discuss their hand protection behaviour.
